








Proposed Open Space Framework


Proposed visw from Redfern Street towards Redfern railway station

- An opportunity exists where Regent and Gibbons Streets can be placed in tunnels under the Redfern Railway Precinct, Regent Street emerging to meet Cleveland Street at grade and Gibbons Street emerging in Abercromble Street, beyond Cleveland Street
- Streetscape improvements such as those achieved to King Street, Newtown, (overhead wires placed on buildings so as to remove poles) or Oxford Street. - Accessibility by local public transport to allow the large numbers of residents within RED who do not own or have access to a car to use Redfem/Regent Streets as their retail and community centre.
- Increases in the number of people working and living in the area will help boost the viability of retail and service outlets.
- Largé scale supermarkets need to be encouraged to boost the areas attractiveness and help retain household expenditure from the whole RED area.




